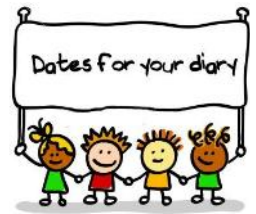

Key Details on Free Fruit for Kids (2026):

Availability: Free fruit is available in-store for children while shopping with parents or carers.

Dates: The offer runs from April 27 to May 31, 2026, and is typically available during school holiday periods.

Purpose: To make healthier choices easier for families and encourage kids to eat more fruit and vegetables.

Tesco Free Fruit & Veg for Schools Program:

Expansion: From September 2026, Tesco is doubling its school program to over 1,000 schools across the UK.

Impact: Since October 2024, the program has provided over 15.7 million portions of fruit and veg to children.

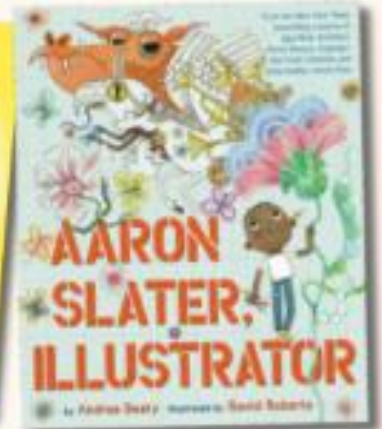
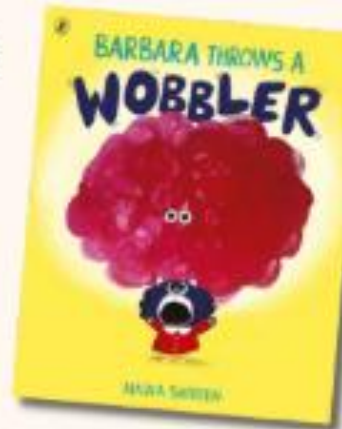
The STORY PROJECT

The Story Project is dedicated to helping children learn **wellbeing and literacy skills** through **the power of stories**.

The Story Project takes popular **children's books** and turns them into **engaging lessons**, so that schools can teach all skills in the PHSE and RHSE curriculum.



Topics, such as emotions, families, health, friendships and more, are explored in a way that allows children to develop **empathy and understanding**.

The lessons promote open discussion, making even complex subjects easy to process.

Over 90% of schools have seen an increase in their children's wellbeing.
